


# ALWAYS ASSUME POWER LINES ARE LIVE



Downed power lines can be **deadly**. Always **assume a downed power line is live** and avoid approaching them or anything near them.

## Use Precaution

<p>1</p>	<p>Downed power lines can energize the ground up to <b>35 feet</b> away. Even more in wet conditions.</p>	<p>2</p>	<p>If you see a downed power line, <b>call 911</b>.</p>
<p>3</p>	<p><b>Never drive over</b> downed power lines or anything in contact with them.</p>	<p>4</p>	<p><b>Never try to move</b> a downed power line.</p>

## Power Line Contact

<p>1</p>	<p>If a vehicle contacts a <b>power line</b> or <b>utility pole</b>, stay away and call 911.</p>	<p>2</p>	<p>Consider <b>all lines</b> to be live and dangerous.</p>
<p>3</p>	<p>Stay in place or inside your vehicle <b>unless you see fire or smoke</b>.</p>	<p>4</p>	<p><b>Warn others</b> to stay at least 35 feet away.</p>
<p>5</p>	<p><b>Tell others</b> not to approach the vehicle, downed lines, or anything that may be in contact with the downed lines.</p>	<p>6</p>	<p>Call <b>911</b>.</p>

## In the Event of Fire or Smoke

<p>1</p>	<p>Do not touch the ground and vehicle <b>at the same time</b>.</p>	<p>2</p>	<p>Jump from the vehicle with <b>your feet together</b>.</p>	<p>3</p>	<p><b>Shuffle</b> at least 50-70 feet away, or about 6 truck lengths, and <b>avoid lifting your feet</b>.</p>
